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

The exhibition will allow the viewer to imagine life in Paris, Moscow and Berlin at the beginning of the 20th century, when the Shchukin brothers were at the height of their power. ### EXHIBITION OF THE WORKS OF ILYA REPIN

Many of Repin's works are world famous, including "Barge Haulers On The

Volga," "We Did Not Wait," and "Zaporozhtsy Writes a Letter to The Turkish Sultan." But this exhibition also includes the artist's little-known works, which will be a real discovery for his admirers. The exhibition in the New Tretyakov Gallery will be followed by a series of projects to mark the 175th anniversary of Repin's birth. These will be held in Russia, France and Finland to enable the modern viewer to get acquainted with the master's work, which in many ways determined the development of Russian art in the second half of the 19th and early 20th centuries.

### THE COLLECTION OF THE LOUIS VUITTON FOUNDATION

The first cooperation between Paris' Louis Vuitton Foundation and Moscow's State

Pushkin Museum of Fine Arts was the exhibition "Masterpieces of New Painting. The Sergei Shchukin Collection," in Paris in 2016-2017. Now the Louis Vuitton Foundation is reciprocating by showing its collection in the Gallery of 19th and 20th Century European and American Art in Moscow. The exhibition includes works by Alberto Giacometti, Yves Klein, Gerhard Richter, Sigmar Polke, Christian Boltansky and Andreas Gursky. It also showcases classics of 20th century art and artists from the younger generation, including Jean-Michel Basquiat, Banksy, Matthew Barney, Takashi Murakami, Pierre Yuig, Cheng Yang and others.

### KEEPERS OF TIME: RESTORATION AT THE MOSCOW KREMLIN MUSEUMS

12 July – 13 October

This exhibition is dedicated to the work of the restoration studios in Moscow's Kremlin Museums over the past five years, and includes unique historical and cultural pieces. On display are state regalia, objects that belonged to the tsars, ceremonial arms, ancient icons and magnificent jewelry made by Russian and European masters. In the exhibition hall of the Assumption Belfry, visitors will be able to see exhibits related to state ceremonies, as well as arms and horse harnesses from the tsars' treasures. Among the most remarkable restored works are splendid diamond crowns, a Renaissance Italian helmet and French tapestries. In the exhibition hall of the Patriarch's Palace visitors will be able to look at artifacts from the Kremlin churches and monasteries, icons, church embroidery and precious items used in vestries.

### HUMANS SEAFOOD HEAVEN

Humans is a seafood restaurant and a bar with wine and cocktails. It is, in a good sense, a versatile place, suitable for dinner with

friends, birthday celebrations or Sunday lunch with parents. Inlaid countertops, dark walls and metal mesh create a pleasant effect, as if you're dining on the seabed. Sterlet, sea urchins, scallops, crabs, lobsters, perch, turbot, sea bream, sea bass, red snapper, squid, cuttlefish and shrimps are all laid out on ice. You can choose any fish and ask for it to be cooked the way you like. The kitchen is equipped with a grill and a smoker. We recommend the Sakhalin scallop carpaccio with its balance of chilled clam, ginger sauce and jalapeno, or the salmon, tuna or crab tartare.

### INOSTRANTSY

#### NEW FAVORITE SPOT

Long before the launch of this project, the creators intrigued people by setting up an Instagram account with photos of strangers in different parts of the world in sweatshirts printed with the name of the future restaurant — Inostrantsy, or foreigners in Russian. The restaurant is already working with world-class chefs. The menu, from Australian chef Tom Halpin, will be frequently updated. On the second floor of the mansion where the restaurant is located, there is a bar with 16 cocktails concocted by Damir Stojkovic from Serbia. The bar hosts parties every weekend, and there are plans in the works for jazz on weekday evenings.

### MARGARITA BISTRO SIMPLY BEAUTIFUL

In the kitchen is Dan Miron, who worked at the Bangkok Gaggan, U.K. celebrity chef Jason Atherton's restaurant in London and Moscow's Holly Fox. Shore House is open all year round in the style of a country home-restaurant on the territory of the yacht club. In summer, a veranda overlooks the Moscow River, yachts moor at the pier and

Stall is the first big project of Natalia Berezova, a graduate of the culinary school founded by legendary French chef and inventor of nouvelle cuisine Paul Bocuse. Up until now Berezova has worked as a freelance chef, so her name is not yet familiar to the general public. She is debuting with this small restaurant serving simple

seasonal dishes. You could eat here every day and not get bored. The chef brings an elegant mixture of French techniques and Asian accents to the dishes, reflecting her experience and interests. The best way to discover this truly great place is to sit down at the counter, French-style, and ask the talented chef herself to advise you on the best dish of the day.

**ABU GOSH****LUNCH IN TEL AVIV**

This small cafe serving Middle Eastern cuisine is new on the Moscow restaurant map, but has already earned some much-deserved attention. With a Lebanese chef in charge of the kitchen, this place probably serves the best hummus in town. There are nine different types — classic, with eggplant, Beirut with tomatoes, spicy with baked pepper, avocado, beetroot, spinach, mango and lamb. The interior of this spot has been thought out down to the smallest detail — decorations and crockery have been collected from all over the world. The chairs are from St. Pe-

### TESTA BEST PIZZA IN TOWN

The name of this place is a play on words — “testo” means dough in Russian and “testa” means head in Italian. Neapolitan-style pizza forms the basis of the menu. The secret is proving the pizza dough for 48 hours, and importing flour and tomato paste from Italy. There are nine options on the menu, from the classic margarita, which you must try, to the hangover pizza with jalapeño. The center of attention in the pizzeria is an open wood-burning stove, around which you'll find a bar. The modern interior is painted in soothing colors. A bright accent is the pink staircase leading to the lower floor, kitchen and bathroom.

### TWINS GARDEN GOURMET EXPERIENCE

This restaurant, managed by the Berezutsky brothers Ivan and Sergey, is a true gastronomic adventure in the very center of the city. Everything here is as functional as possible, with minimal decorative elements and lots of space, so as not to distract you from the food. The restaurant has two levels — on the first is the main hall and the chef's table zone, and on the second a digestif bar and a panoramic veranda. Most of the ingredients used in the dishes come from the Berezutskys' own farm, leading to the use of the word “garden” in the name of the restaurant. The twins' 50 hectares of land in the Kaluga region provide about two thirds of the produce. A must-try is the six-course tasting menu, which includes fried green peppers with feijoa and ricotta made from Nubian goats' milk, and saddle of kid with broccoli and pomegranate.

of Russian culture. Here, Mikhail Sholokhov, Konstantin Simonov, Mikhail Zoshchenko and many other famous writers and poets read their works to enthralled audiences. Antique furniture and fixtures from the 19th and 20th centuries are pre-

served in the hallowed halls. Admire the carved chairs, antique buffets and decorative elements while you enjoy the carefully prepared and lovingly presented classics of Russian cuisine. Among the specialties we recommend the sterlet, rabbit

leg with cowberry sauce or leg of suckling pig with buckwheat porridge and horseradish sauce.





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# MARGARITA MAMUN

## CHAT WITH THE CHAMP

**I**N RIO DE JANEIRO IN 2016, YOU WON THE OLYMPIC GOLD MEDAL FOR RHYTHMIC GYMNASTICS. SINCE THEN, A LOT OF THINGS HAVE HAPPENED IN YOUR LIFE — YOU DECIDED TO LEAVE PROFESSIONAL SPORT AND YOU GOT MARRIED. TELL US PLEASE, WHAT IS GOING ON IN YOUR LIFE NOW? I had been training since I was seven years old, from morning till night. I devoted my whole life to sport. I saw my family very rarely, and I almost never saw my friends. The most I could do was go to the cinema on a weekend or go home on a Sunday. Now that I have quit professional sport I can do everything that ordinary people do — travel and spend quality time with family. Before I was doing nothing but sports.

Since 2017, the year I retired from rhythmic gymnastics, my main activity has been doing master classes all over the world. That has become very popular in the sport. While teaching these classes I have been to the places I never managed to visit when I was competing — Mexico, China, Europe, America and large parts of Russia. I can't even remember where I haven't been. But I still very much enjoy just walking in Moscow on a sunny day. I joke all the time that I've just now became a true Muscovite, even though I was born in Moscow, because before all I knew was my route from my home in the south-west of the city to the training center in the North. In fact, I knew nothing about the city except Red Square and Troparevsky Park. Now I can enjoy my city to the fullest — I can walk, watch movies, read, meet with friends, spend time with my family, travel, teach master classes. I enjoy every moment of

my life. Even the not so easy renovation of my apartment, which I'm also enjoying simply because it has never happened to me before.

**YOU WERE BORN IN MOSCOW, AND AFTER ALL THE SUCCESS AND POPULARITY THAT YOU HAVE GAINED, YOU HAVE NOT MOVED ABROAD LIKE MANY OTHER PROFESSIONAL ATHLETES, BUT STAYED IN MOSCOW. WHY?**

I was born in Moscow and for me this is my home. I've always had a desire to travel, to see the world, but I never thought about moving to another city. I love my city very much and I love my country. My relatives and friends are here.

**WHAT ARE THE FIRST THREE WORDS THAT COME TO YOUR MIND WHEN YOU THINK OF MOSCOW?**

Home, beauty and traffic jams.

**WHERE IN MOSCOW WOULD WE MEET YOU?**

Well, probably in Evropeysky Shopping Center, because the flagship of the Under Armour store is located there, and I'm their brand ambassador. Also, on Red Square. If I meet up with friends, I often park my car next to GUM or TSUM, and pass by the square.

**WHAT ARE YOUR FAVORITE PLACES IN THE CITY?**

The observation deck on Vorobyovy Gory, Red Square and Moscow Manege, probably because I was proposed to there. I love summer evenings in Gorky Park. And I also adore the south-west region of Moscow, I grew up there and have such fond memories of the place.

**IF ONE OF YOUR FRIENDS HAD JUST LANDED IN MOSCOW, WHERE WOULD YOU ADVISE THEM TO GO?**

First of all, I would recommend traveling to Moscow either in summer or in the run-up to the New Year. Definitely not in March or April (laughs). Moscow is flourishing in summer and winter. Go to the observation deck to see the Moscow State University building, and have a walk through Patriarch's Ponds.

**SUMMER IS APPROACHING, WHAT ARE YOUR PLANS?**

Walk around Moscow and go somewhere for a quick vacation, just because I do not want to miss the beautiful summer in Moscow. I also plan to finally go to the planetarium, take a walk in Kolomenskoye and have barbecues.

**IS THERE ANY STORY OR EVENT THAT IS INEXTRICABLY LINKED WITH THE CITY, AND WHICH MAKES YOU SMILE WHILE THINKING ABOUT IT?**

There are many of them! On one of my first dates with my hus-



band, we went to Gorky Park. At the time you could climb up Pushkin Bridge, and there my husband — Russian competitive swimmer Alexandre Sukhorukov — wanted to impress me and we decided to climb it together. We ended up spending several hours up there and watched the sunset, the whole Moscow River was under our feet. It was incredible! But when we remember it now cold sweat appears, and we swear that we will never do such a thing again. So please no one repeat this! I'm glad they put up barriers because it was pretty dangerous.


**WHAT ARE YOUR FAVORITE RESTAURANTS AND CAFES IN MOSCOW? AND WHAT DISHES DO YOU USUALLY ORDER?**

My favorite is wasabi shrimps in the Strana Kotoroy Net restaurant. I go there only because of them and the best thing is that they cook them very quickly as well. I love Chips restaurant, we often meet with friends there. I love their mini chebureki with beef. I also love Khleb Nasushny and their raspberry or blueberry tartlets, they definitely don't skimp on the berries there. Another favorite place is the Olive Beach in Gorky Park — it's right beside the Pushkin Bridge. You can lie down on a deck chair right by the Moscow River and feel like you're on the beach.

**WE KNOW THAT YOU TRAVEL A LOT. WHAT, IN YOUR OPINION, IS DIFFERENT IN MOSCOW COMPARED WITH ALL OTHER WORLD CAPITALS?**


Recently I was in Toronto, Canada and, of course, I compared it with Moscow. I realized that Moscow is a city with a great history. I like it a lot. There is spirit, a business center with high-rise buildings next to ancient houses. There are beautiful wide streets, forests, a lot of greenery, a river... This is my hometown, this city is for me.

Margarita Mamun, 'The Bengal Tiger' of the Russian rhythmic gymnastic's team, is a world-class athlete born in Moscow, who made her biggest dream come true — winning Olympic gold during the summer games in Rio 2016. The 23 year old, who is also seven-times world champion and four-times European champion, officially completed her career in 2017. Since then, she has married, become the brand ambassador for Under Armour in Russia and been pretty busy running around the world teaching master classes. But while in Moscow, she found a little time to tell us her latest news and talked about the perks of living in Moscow during the summer.







## HERMITAGE MUSEUM SHCHUKIN AND MOROZOV

**June to October**

Two parallel exhibitions at the Hermitage — one starting on June 18 and the other on June 21— showcase two great Russian collectors, Sergey Shchukin and Ivan Morozov. After the two collectors fled the country after the October Revolution their collections remained behind and became part of the newly-formed State Museum of New Western Art GMNZI. ## KAYAK

If you are looking for a way to tone your arms and explore the city at the same time, kayaking is all you need. Plenty of facilities scattered around the city will give you the opportunity to rent a canoe for however long you like. However, a much better option is to book a city tour in a kayak. Visit the historical parts of the city in a morning tour, or join a day trip to venture outside the city and enjoy the scenery surrounding Ladoga lake, the stunning region of Karelia or Vyborg bay.

THROUGHOUT THE WHOLE SUMMER YOU CAN FIND FREE YOGA SESSIONS, RUNNING GROUPS AND OTHER WORKOUTS TAKING PLACE IN DIFFERENT PARKS IN THE CITY. JUST MAKE SURE TO CHECK THE FACEBOOK EVENTS NEAR YOU REGULARLY AND YOU WILL DEFINITELY FIND SOMETHING TO SUIT YOU.

### RUNNING

**E**xplore the city with a long morning run of 42 kilometers in one of the most awaited events for every endurance runner in Russia. The White Nights Marathon on June 30, attracts thousands of participants every year and offers prizes ranging from 15,000 to 300,000 rubles for the first eight finishers.

### PING PONG

**U**nlike in most European cities, ping-pong tables in St. Petersburg are few and far between, and finding a good place outdoors is often a real challenge. Dunes Bar in Ligovskiy is one of the best summer destinations for table tennis players, where games are accompanied by music from a live DJ and improved by a drink or two.

### JET SKI

**N**ow that the Neva river has finally returned to its liquid state, the stage is set for some winter sports right in the middle of the city. One of the most exciting activities you can do is a spin on a jet ski. Rental outlet Po Volnam on Krestovsky Island offers different options, from thirty minutes or one hour to 24 hours, depending on your lust for adventure. Jet skies will give you a charge of adrenaline and the chance to see the city from a different point of view. Definitely worth trying.



### FLYBOARDS

**S**t. Petersburg's canals offer plenty of options for exploration during the summer. Perhaps one of the most original is on top of a flyboard. This unique sport, commonly known as hydroflying, allows you to glide into the air on the top of a board connected to a hydroflighting device. You can rent the equipment at Flyjets on Krestovsky Island and learn how to master flying over water.

### TENNIS

**O**ne of the best places in the city to play tennis is Ekateringof park. Surrounded by nature and isolated from the traffic, Ekateringof has five tennis courts and plenty of facilities to teach you to play tennis or improve your skills. Prices range between 500 and 800 roubles per hour, depending on the time and day of the week, with the option of private classes for 700 roubles.

I really like to walk along the embankments of the Griboedov Canal and the Moyka towards the Mariinsky Theater and New Holland. This is the very center of the city, but it is still quite deserted.

### WHERE ARE THE BEST PLACES FOR SHOPPING IN ST. PETERSBURG?

The cheese shop on the ground floor of my apartment building is my own personal favorite place to shop!

### WHAT IS YOUR FAVORITE PLACE IN ST. PETERSBURG?

I really like Kanonerskiy Ostrov, especially now with the new overpass. For me it's a wild combination of huge abandoned buildings and giant ferry boats sailing by.

### WHERE WOULD YOU ADVISE A FRIEND WHO JUST ARRIVED IN THE CITY TO GO?

I'd tell them to go to Kunstkamera. It has Peter the Great's



collection of pulled teeth and some embalmed embryos. It was my favorite museum as a child.

### WHAT WAS THE LAST EXHIBITION OR MUSEUM YOU VISITED?

"Autumn of the Russian Middle Ages" in the Russian Museum.

### WHICH BARS DO YOU GO TO ON A FRIDAY NIGHT TO DANCE AND HAVE FUN?

Me and my friends Olga and Sasha Berkovsky have a bar called "Mishka", which just turned eight years old, and a club, "Tantsploshchadka". Mishka has a great house-party atmosphere with cocktails and reckless fun. "Tantsploshchadka" is a disco with DJs like Floating Points, Kim Ann Foxman and Hunee. I would also advise everyone to go to the underground club called "Klub", or "Kislotty" for young and angry hectic techno. It's a very good spot.

### WHERE DO YOU GO FOR A RUN?


